

## CONFERENCE WORKSHOPS

### 1. GREENING STEM CURRICULA

The workshop will introduce a green STEM 'Futures' activity from the 25 hour Nuffield Foundation curriculum development project. Curriculum focus: STEM subjects (KS3 and 4). Facilitator: Angela Hall, director of Nuffield Foundation's new Green STEM curriculum project.

### 2. GREENING PRIMARY SCIENCE CURRICULA

With North Yorkshire County Council Science Advisory Team.

### 3. EXPLORING GEOGRAPHICAL ISSUES IN SHEFFIELD

A two hour field trip into Sheffield with an opportunity for interaction with the public on a key sustainability issue. Return to Megacentre for debriefing and lunch. Curriculum focus: Geography and learning outside the classroom (KS 2, 3 & 4). Facilitator: John Lyon, Programme Director, Geographical Association.

### 4. MANY HEAVENS, ONE EARTH

A brief presentation on the Alliance of Religions and Conservation (ARC) multi-faith climate change work [www.arc-world.org](http://www.arc-world.org) followed by an activity that explores curriculum development possibilities within RE curricula. Curriculum focus: RE (KS 2, 3 & 4). Facilitators: Victoria Finlay, Communications Director, ARC and Sarah Fishwick Global Education Advisor, Dioceses of Bradford and Ripon & Leeds.

### 5. GREEN CAREERS

A new 5 minute Green Careers film from Yorkshire Forward/ U-xplore. Discussion on how this film could be used in careers advice sessions to focus young peoples attention on career opportunities in the emerging green/low carbon economy. Curriculum focus: careers advice (KS4). Facilitator: Sue Smith, U-xplore and careers adviser.

### 6. THE GLOBAL DIMENSION AND SUSTAINABLE SCHOOLS

This workshop will focus on developing primary and secondary classroom ideas to embed the global dimension and sustainable development in the curriculum through creating compelling learning experiences. Curriculum focus: cross Curricular (KS 2 & 3). Facilitators: Mick Bradley and Ray Kirtley Y & H Global Schools Association.

### 7. DESIGNING WITH A 'CLOSED LOOP' PHILOSOPHY

Introducing 'closed loop' thinking in D&T curricula using a short activity. This is one of a series of classroom activities developed by Practical Action/Centre for Alternative Technology. The activities can be adapted for use in primary schools as well as for GCSE students. See <http://tinyurl.com/ylnmles> What is 'Closed loop' thinking? ### 8. MONEY, DEBT AND ESD

A story and activity around the creation of money as debt and its consequences. The missing link in most education for sustainable development (ESD) programmes is understanding the role of money, debt and interest. Discussion on ways to build such ESD foci into enterprise education activities. Curriculum focus: Business Studies and Enterprise dimension (KS 4). Facilitators: Ken Webster, ESD Consultant and Jane Walton, Y & H Director Make Your Mark enterprise education programme.

### 9. EXTENDED SCHOOLS AND SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

A session on curriculum development work linked to extended schools programmes. Curriculum focus: cross curricular links with extended schools programmes (KS 1-4). Facilitator: Chris Bulman and Extended Schools team at North Lincolnshire Council.

### 10. SUSTAINABLE FOOD AND HEALTHY SCHOOLS

This workshop will introduce an exemplar sustainable food activity developed by Y & H Sustainable Food Education Programme ([www.yorkshireandhumber.net/esd/food](http://www.yorkshireandhumber.net/esd/food)). Discussion on how sustainable food-focussed curriculum work in Leeds schools has been linked to the Healthy Schools and Sustainable Schools frameworks. Curriculum focus: links with Healthy Schools (KS 2 & 3). Facilitators: Steve Ruse, Sustainable Schools Consultant, Education Leeds with Kay Whitfield and Sally Tottle, consultants for Y & H Sustainable Food Education Project.

### 11. PHILOSOPHY FOR CHILDREN

This session will use an exemplar stimulus to introduce workshop participants to the Philosophy for Children methodology (see [www.sapere.org.uk](http://www.sapere.org.uk)). Curriculum focus: cross curricular emphasis on Sustainable Development and Creativity / Critical thinking dimensions. Also the Care dimension of Sustainable Schools framework (KS 1, 2, 3 & 4) Facilitator: Dick Palfrey, Philosophy for Children tutor and SIO-History, Geography & EE, Kirklees Learning Service.

### 12A. CURRICULUM PLANNING: A PRIMARY APPROACH

A whole school approach to curriculum planning at St Barnabas Primary School, York has enabled a tight focus on Sustainability using the topic title 'We Care'. This cross curricular planning will demonstrate the benefits of using a wide variety of resources within the community to help pupils consider the need to develop a responsible attitude in order to sustain healthy, happy lifestyles. Facilitator: Vikki Pendry, Advanced Skills Teacher for Sustainable Schools, St Barnabas CE Primary School, York.

### 12B. LINKING DIVERSE CURRICULA IN SECONDARY SCHOOLS

This workshop will contain elements of policies, action plans, audits and ideas for whole school off timetable days. Experience emerging from Hemsworth College's sustainability action research with the National College for Leadership of Schools. Facilitator: Catherine Sykes, Curriculum manager, Hemsworth Arts & Community College, Pontefract, West Yorkshire.
